## MAYOR & CITY COUNCIL CORNER

### Update on an East / West Connector Road

Will Highland ever get a road south of SR-92 connecting SR-74 (Alpine Highway) and North County Boulevard (4800 West)? That question is one I have heard more times than any other single question I get asked as a city councilman. The question has been asked for several decades now. The road has been on the Highland City's master transportation plan since the 1980s. The road is moving forward but it is moving at the speed of government. Although the progress has been slow, there has been major progress making an East/West connector road a reality. In 2009 the Highland City council had engineering plans created and two homes were purchased to preserve a corridor for the road. In 2011 the council signed an agreement with the county where the county would build and pay for the road and the city would install the utilities and maintain the road. In 2013 the American Fork Developmental Center (AFDC) completed their general plans for the development of their property between the Lone Peak High School and the Training School. This would allow the road to go through their property. In this year's legislative session, the Utah legislature approved the AFDC plans so the AFDC could move forward with their plans. We are now working through the details of the plans. There may need to be more legislative involvement before the road can begin to be built, but we are making progress and there appears to be some light at the end of this long, long tunnel.

### Winter Snow Removal & Plowing

During the winter months it is important for Highland residents and the City to work together during snow removal weather. During heavy snow storms it can take as much as 48 hours to clear all priority routes and through streets once the storm has subsided. Parking on the street and objects in the road (trailers, basketball standards, etc.) makes it difficult for plows to clear the streets. Vehicles may not park on City Streets between 12:00 a.m. - 8:00 a.m., December 1st through March 31st, and anytime snow is present. The Police Department may issue a parking citation.

Many people use 4 wheelers to plow their drive ways and sidewalks; the Police Department reminds you that 4 wheelers are not allowed on the street unless they are street legal.

### Cemetery Decoration Clean-Up

The Highland Cemetery will be cleared of all flowers, trinkets, ornaments, lamps, shepherd-crooks, etc. on **Monday, December 1**. Please remove items before this day.

Any items removed by City Staff during this clean-up day will be taken to the Public Works Shop (4066 West 1100 North) and held for one (1) week so they may be claimed by the owner. If items are not claimed within the week, they will be discarded.

## Curbside Recycling

Highland City has partnered with Republic Services to bring convenient recycling to a curb near you! With curbside recycling all recyclable items can be placed into one container. No sorting necessary!



All your papers, plastics, cardboards, and metals in go in the same blue cart. Just roll it out to the curb every other Friday! Worried about the cost? You can get a recycling bin for only **\$4.45 a month! 70% of what you throw out is recyclable**. Consider swapping out your second garbage can for a recycling container. This will **save you \$35.00 dollars a year**. Contact the Utility Billing Office at 801-756-5751 to get your recycle container and start saving today!

## Acceptable Items

The following items can be recycled: Newspaper, magazines, glossy ads (paperclips & staples ok), telephone books, plastic containers #1-7 (soda bottles, water bottles, milk jugs, laundry detergent bottles, juice bottles, grocery bags, any natural colored or clear plastic containers), tin cans (labels can be left on), aluminum cans, corrugated cardboard, cereal boxes, tissue boxes, metal hangers, paper towel/toilet paper rolls, junk mail, office paper, wrapping paper, gift boxes, tissue paper, shoe boxes, holiday cards/envelopes, paper gift bags.

## Unacceptable Items

The following items can not be recycled through the curbside program: Glass, Styrofoam (packing peanuts, etc.), food and liquids, green waste (tree limbs, grass, etc.), dirt, rocks, large appliances, plastics not labeled #1-7 (see list above), ribbon and bows, sticky gift labels, laminated or coated gift bags, small appliances, aerosol cans, paint cans, light bulbs.

Guidelines to ensure consistent service:

All containers *must* be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m.

Place the container in the street with the wheels against the curb or within 2 feet of the blacktop, and the front of the container facing the street.

The containers must be placed 4 feet apart from other containers and 8 feet from mailboxes, poles, fences, trees, or parked vehicles for easy access.
