



NOTICE OF OUTDOOR WATER CONSERVATION EFFECTIVE 2015

Highland City's pressurized irrigation (PI) system and the high quality water it supplies is a valuable resource for residents. The City's primary water source for the PI system is the American Fork River and water from Deer Creek Reservoir. These sources of water will be limited as we are entering a very low water year due to the inadequate snowfall this past winter. Highland City is encouraging water conservation efforts to allow sufficient water throughout the spring and summer to all residents. Typically, our community over waters lawns 50% more than necessary.

It is necessary for all residents to conserve water wherever possible to avoid any mandatory watering restrictions. In order to accomplish this, we are asking that you follow these voluntary guidelines to help conserve water:

- Watering Days according to the following schedule:
 - * Even Numbered Street Address: Monday, Wednesday, and Friday
 - * Odd Numbered Street Address: Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday
 - * No Sunday Residential Watering, allowing the storage facilities to fill.
- Limit of Hours: Recommended watering between the hours of 6:00 p.m. - 10:00 a.m.
- Prepare lawn and yard by taking the following conservation measures:
 - * Water deeper and less frequently
 - * Mulch around outdoor plants and shrubs
 - * Raise the lawn mower to retain moisture near grass roots
 - * Provide recommended fertilizer to lawns
 - * Spot water dry spots with a hose versus running a sprinkler cycle
- Adjust sprinkler timers through the year and do your part to conserve water by turning off sprinklers after rain storms. The chart below provides guidelines for lawn watering rates as provided by the State Division of Water Resources for spray type heads.

- Manage Runoff: Adjust sprinklers to water lawns, flowers, and gardens. Avoid excessive flow and runoff onto sidewalks and streets.

Through proper utilization and conservation of our precious water resources all residents will have sufficient water through the year.

All Highland City Customers: Highland City provides a service to its residents in maintaining its parks and other grassy areas by providing sufficient water in order to keep them green and healthy. Highland City provides irrigation water through the city owned and operated pressurized irrigation system for the maintenance of approximately 176 acres. The cost of the water used for these areas is approximately \$57,100 per year. The City transfers funds from the Pressurized Irrigation Revenue account to the General Fund Revenue account for the use of that water. Due to this transfer the Office of the Utah State Auditor requires we notify our residents and hold a Public Hearing. The Public Hearing will be held Tuesday, June 16, 2015 at 7:00 pm. You are invited to attend the Public Hearing and voice any concerns you may have regarding the transfer of funds to pay for the irrigation water used for these areas.

Tampering of Irrigation Water Gates

With summer now upon us and our children beginning their summer break we find ourselves enjoying the outdoors in many different capacities. As the days get longer and warmer we have a tendency to spend more time outdoors. It is at this time that we find that we have an increase of vandalism.

One item that I wish to address specifically is the tampering of the irrigation water gates. We have recently seen the locks on the gates being broken and the gates closed thus the water is backing up the ditch's and flooding over its banks. Although this may seem harmless to some the potential to cause serious damage to property and homes by flooding could be into the tens of thousands of dollars. The damages incurred could be passed along to those that caused the flooding not to mention the possibility of criminal charges.

We would ask that you help us keep an eye on this issue and contact the Police if you see anybody breaking the locks or tampering with the gates.


