### August 1

The Final Plat for Beacon Hills Plat G Phases 3 & 4 at 12500 North 6100 West was approved. The developer will now work with staff to get their civil plans approved before starting the building process.

The Preliminary Plat for Ruby Estates located at 10400 North 6000 West was approved. The developer will now work with staff on their Final Plat application & Civil Plans before coming back to City Council at a future date.

The contract with Utah County on cost sharing of the 4800 West project was approved. See the update on this in the Road Construction article.

The plat for Timp View Point Subdivision (west of Arctic Circle) was amended to include 2 lots. A commercial entity is interested in building on the property in the near future.

The contract for construction on 11800 North was approved. See the update on this in the Road Construction article.

### 11800 North and Highland Boulevard Intersection

In order to provide a safer area for school crossings, the City narrowed the road width and added reduced speed signs.

### 4800 West and Alpine Highway Intersection

In order to facilitate better traffic flow, a right turn only lane is planned to be added for those traveling south on 4800 West and turning west onto Alpine Highway. While the plan was to originally begin construction on that right away, due to pricing constraints, the project will now be bid in the winter and construction take place in the spring.
