Council Brief

August 6

City Council approved an amendment to the Development Code to allow produce stands with a temporary use permit to be located on arterial streets where the street intersects another arterial street or collector road. This allows for 7 possible locations such as where the Sugar Sweet Produce stand is on the corner of SR 92 and 6000 W. Right now only produce stand are allowed, however City Council is interested in hearing your feedback on whether other temporary uses such as snow cone vendors or Christmas tree lots should also be allowed in those areas. August 20

City Council approved the reconstruction of the Canterbury Circle Neighborhood Park Tennis Court. The surface will be reconstructed and a new fence will be installed. The court will be striped with tennis, pickleball, and basketball lines and will have a tennis net and basketball standards installed. Residents will need to bring their own portable pickle ball nets. Construction will begin Spring 2020.

Outdoor Watering Restrictions

Please remember the following watering restrictions:

- Water between 6:00 PM and 10:00 AM
- Even addresses – water Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Odd addresses – water Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday
- Station watering time limited to 30 minutes
- No excessive water runoff

Violation of these restrictions will result in penalties including written warnings, fines, and service locks. These restrictions are important to help our system operate properly as well as save water for future years when we don't receive a large snowpack. There will be two more *Yard of the Month* awards this year – September and October. If you would like to nominate someone, please send your nominations to wisecaryj@gmail.com.

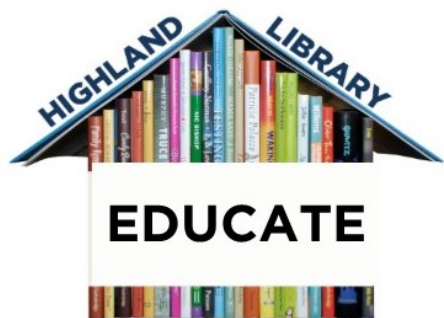
Friends of the Library

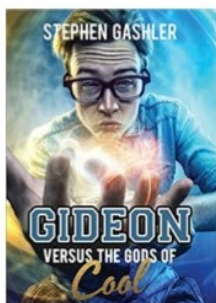
Highland Historical Society
