April 21

The City Council approved contracts for the 2020 road preservation and rehabilitation projects. Construction will take place beginning in June. Watch for detailed information from the City on these and more construction projects that will take place throughout the summer.

The City Council approved a contract with Waste Management to begin hauling the City's garbage and recycling beginning in July. More on this on page 2.

Staff and Council began discussion on the FY2021 preliminary budget. Given the ever changing situation with COVID-19, the budget will likely greatly change until it is finally adopted by Council in June.

City's Response to COVID-19

The City is constantly monitoring the COVID-19 situation. As it is ever changing, please see www.HighlandCity.org for the most up-to-date information regarding City Hall, Public Meetings, the Library, Lone Peak Fire & Police, Justice Court, Events, Arts Council, Parks, Trails, Playgrounds, Facility Rentals, etc.

During this time the City has made accommodations so that all City business may be conducted either over the phone or online.

Planning Corner

City Council recently passed an ordinance modifying accessory dwelling units and basement apartments in the City and establishing conditions which must be met to protect the residential character of our neighborhoods. Conditions include, but are not limited to the following:

- Accessory dwelling unit shall only be permitted in single-family homes that are owner occupied.
- Accessory dwelling unit shall not be permitted in detached accessory buildings and must be attached to the main dwelling unit.
- No more than one (1) accessory dwelling unit shall be considered for each single-family home.
- The unit and home shall be modified to meet all fire, safety, health, and building code requirements.
- The entrance to the accessory dwelling unit shall be provided from the rear of the home. A side entrance is allowable in the event that the entrance is camouflaged by property fencing or landscaping and is not visible from the street.
- The front of the home shall not be modified to appear to have separate units except separate addresses to assist first responders.

An application is required to register an accessory dwelling unit. Applications are reviewed by the community development department. If it is a new accessory dwelling unit, the applicant will also have to file for a building permit. Any building permit fees are in addition to the accessory dwelling unit fees.

Spring Clean-up

The Spring Clean-up has been rescheduled for May 29 and 30. Dumpsters will be in the parking lot at the mouth of American Fork Canyon from 8:00AM—5:00PM that Friday and Saturday. The dumpsters are for disposing of metal, wood and household waste only. Green waste should be taken directly to Timpanogos Special Service District. This clean-up is for Highland residents only. Please bring current proof of residency, which will be verified at the entry. Please follow the directions of the staff members on site.

We are taking extra precautions to protect the health of our citizens and staff. Due to physical distancing guidelines, we are unable to help residents unload items from their vehicles. Please bring someone with you if you will need help unloading. A staff member will be onsite with a loader to help move heavy items from the ground into the dumpster.

Pressurized Irrigation Water

The pressurized irrigation system is up and running for the season. The weather had been mild enough that little irrigation is needed so far. When you are watering, please be water wise and remember the city guidelines.

- Water between 6 PM and 10 AM
- Even-numbered addresses water Monday, Wednesday, & Friday.
- Odd-numbered addresses water Tuesday, Thursday, & Saturday
- Station watering time limited to 30 minutes
- No excessive water runoff

Waste Removal Contract

The City's contract with Republic Services ends in June. In an effort to provide the best service to residents, the City Council had staff send the contract out to bid. City Council selected Waste Management Services out of the three firms that bid. They offered the best value and the City Council believes they will provide excellent service. Republic will continue servicing the City through June 30 and Waste Management will take over after that.

Residents will have new cans delivered from Waste Management towards the end of June. The new pick-up schedules and rates will be announced when they are finalized.


Youth Council Corner

Fire Fuel Reduction Guide

As we all know, open spaces in Highland are valued for their nature and beauty. Living within the Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) provides us with a sense of nature, yet there are dangers that must be mitigated and each of us should do our part. To help in that endeavor, the Lone Peak Fire Department has developed a Fire Fuel Reduction Guide & Inspection Checklist. We may not be able to stop wildfires but we can mitigate that risk by planning and proper fuel management. Creating a defensible space around our homes may help to reduce risk to our lives, properties, community, and firefighters. 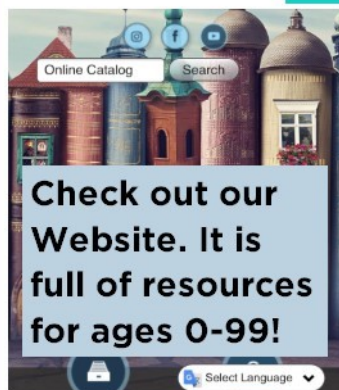

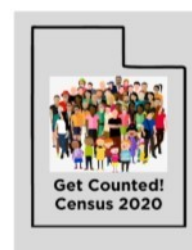
