


Mayors Message - Kurt Ostler



Starting last summer and continuing throughout this year, the city will be installing secondary water pressurized irrigation meters throughout the city. With this installation, residents have had a lot of questions. In 1998, Highland City bonded for and installed a city-wide secondary water pressurized irrigation system. Starting in 1998 and

continuing today, new development is required to connect to the city's pressurized system and provide water shares to the city. In 2019, the State of Utah legislature mandated that cities meter their secondary water system. The overall cost of the secondary meter system for Highland City is \$10 million. The city received \$7 million from state and federal grants, with the city providing \$3 million from pressurized irrigation enterprise funds reserves to fund the meters. Based on the new legislation, the city must have a pressurized irrigation tiered water charge based on usage as part of receiving the grant funds and the Utah State Legislature's new bill passage. The city plans to use next summer 2025 pressurized water usage data to help determine these rates, with usage rates going into effect in 2026. The city will provide the residents, starting next summer, 2025, with their usage data on their utility bills, and it will also be available online to help each resident best determine their usage. April 29, 2024

- ◆ City Council approved an interlocal agreement with the cities of Lehi, American Fork, Draper, Alpine, and Cedar Hills to consider forming a new school district. This is the first step in a multi-step process. Next, a feasibility study will be presented to the six cities regarding the new school district on Tuesday, June 18 at 5:00 PM at Highland City Hall. Public hearings on the topic will then be held for Highland City on July 2 and July 16 with a final Council vote on Tuesday, August 6. The Council vote would be to place the item on the November ballot for final voter decision.

May 7, 2024

- ◆ City Council approved the FY25 tentative budget. The final budget will be considered by Council on Tuesday, June 18. The tentative budget is available at <https://bit.ly/HC-budget>.
- ◆ An updated master plan for Mountain Ridge Park was approved that shifted the ninja course further into the park and away from adjacent homes.
- ◆ The Council approved a project to place curb, gutter, and sidewalk and do asphalt widening on the southern portion of 11200 North from 6000 West to 5909 West and on 6000 West along the first property frontage south of 11200 North.

May 21, 2024

- ◆ The Council updated park hours for facilities to 6AM to 10PM with trail use starting at 5AM.

Public Hearing - Pressurized Irrigation Enterprise Fund

Tuesday, June 18, 7:00 PM at City Hall

The General Fund pays the Pressurized Irrigation (PI) Fund \$108,000 per year to water the approximately 179 acres of parks, park strip grass, and vegetation owned by the City. It is proposed that the PI Fund transfer funds back into the General Fund in the amount of \$108,000 to make the General Fund whole for this cost. The purpose of this hearing is to notify the public of this proposal. The \$108,000 represents 1.35% of the Fiscal year 2024-2025 budgeted expenses of the PI Fund.

Mosquito Abatement

The Utah County Mosquito Abatement Spraying Season for 2024 is set to kick off in June, depending on weather and surveillance data. Crews will spray through mid-September. You can expect crews to be spraying Monday through Thursday evenings after the sun goes down. Firework Restrictions For the month of July, state law allows fireworks to be shot from July 2 to July 5 and July 22 to July 25 from 11:00 am - 11:00 pm except on July 4 and July 24 where hours extend to midnight.

Due to fire danger, fireworks are prohibited in certain areas of Highland including many subdivisions.

Highland staff strive to provide clean, safe drinking water and this is evident in our 2023 water quality report that can be found in the insert included with this newsletter.

PI Watering Schedule

- ◆ If your house number ends in an **EVEN** number: your watering days are Monday, Wednesday and Friday
- ◆ If your house number ends in an **ODD** number: your watering days are Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday

No watering allowed on Sundays except for City, Churches and Schools. This schedule helps our system run smoothly and ensures everyone has enough pressure to water.


