Highland City has purchased a wood chipper and will make it available for trees picked up by scouts on **January 3, 2004.** Scouts should bring the trees to the location west of the Public Works Building, 4644 West 11000 North.

BFI will also pick up Christmas trees following the scout pick up. **Trees must be at curbside by 7:00 a.m., on January 14,** and will be picked up through January 16 until the entire city has been covered. Trees don't need to be cut up. If trees aren't picked up by the January 16, they need to be cut up and taken to the Timpanogos Special Service District, but must be free of tinsel, lights, etc. Flocked trees cannot be chopped up by the Timp District and will need to be cut up and placed in garbage cans to be disposed of through the regular garbage pick-up.
