BURN PERMITS

The one month window set by Utah County this year for the burn period is **March 15 -April 12.**

Unless you have an agricultural burn permit this will be the only time you can burn.

You may get a FREE Burn Permit from the Highland City Hall, Monday through Thursday, 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Remember to call Central Dispatch at 374-BURN (2876) on the day you plan to burn to determine if the air quality is good. Please read your permit very carefully to follow the 11 conditions which you must meet in order to burn.
