ELECTION INFORMATION!

This year's municipal election on November 3, 2009 will fill vacancies for Mayor and two City Council positions (all 4-year terms). If needed, a primary election will be held on September 15, 2009.

The filing period for those interested in running for office is July 1 through July 15, 2009. Candidates must be a registered voter and a resident of the City for 12 months prior to the election. Candidates must also submit a Nomination Petition (forms available at the City Recorders Office) and collect 81 signatures of registered voters in Highland City. Forms **MUST** be turned in no later than 5:00 p.m. on July 15. The City Offices are closed on Fridays. If you have questions about registering to vote or becoming a candidate, please contact the City Recorder at 801-772-4506.

SEWER FEE UPDATE!

As part of the recently adopted FY2010 Budget, the City implemented a 30% increase to sewer fees effective July 1. Most of this is due to the fee increase approved by TSSD. The base residential fee will go from \$19.32 to \$25.12 per month.

Exciting News! Timpanogos Cave Visitors Center

The City would like to thank Congressman Jim Matheson who was able to secure inclusion of \$1,600,000 in funding for the construction of the Timpanogos Cave National Monument Visitors Center. As the gateway community for the Timpanogos Cave National Monument, this vital facility will significantly benefit Highland City, as well as benefiting Utah County and the State of Utah.



Because of the significance of this project, legislation was passed a number of years ago that set forth a plan for the Forest Service to purchase 37.5 acres of land with a land swap. The US Park Service would then pay for construction of the Visitors Center and inter-agency administrative offices. It has long been the desire of leadership with the Timpanogos Cave National Monument Visitors Center, the local Forest Service as well as the local communities to see the construction of this facility. Highland City, American Fork, Lehi, Cedar Hills and Utah County are strongly in favor of moving this vital facility forward. Congressman Matheson's leadership in successfully securing this funding will help break through the federal red tape needed to make this a reality. It is expected that the House Appropriations Committee will consider the bill and send it to the Full House for passage before July 4th.


