MAYOR'S CORNER

The election season is over and now it is back to a somewhat normal, however we define it. The business of the City goes forward concentrating on our fall preparation for winter. Snow removal will be a focus, assuming we have a heavy snow year. We hope we do; we need the water next summer.

We hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving with your families. As we look forward to Christmas it is a good time to remember "home and auto security". We have had a few incidents of homes broken into and burglarized. In at least one case the door was left unlocked and no one was home. In another case the adults were gone for just a few minutes and younger children were home and confronted the intruder who assaulted them. Another neighbor left his garage door open for 30 minutes at 9:00 a.m. on a Sunday morning and had a new pressure washer stolen from his garage while the rest of the family was at home. Yes, right here in Highland. In past years we have felt removed from this type of activity, but as we grow and highways allow would-be thieves to come from other areas quickly, we are not immune.

Winter Snow Removal & Plowing

With winter here, it is important for Highland residents and the City to work together during snow removal weather. During heavy snow storms it can take as much as 48 hours to clear all priority routes and through streets once the storm has subsided. Vehicles may not park on City Streets between 12:00 a.m. - 8:00 a.m., December 1st through March 31st, and any-time snow is present. The Police Department may issue a parking citation. Parking on the street makes it difficult for plows to clear the streets. Election Results

Highland City Council held a special meeting on Tuesday November 20, 2012 verifying and approving the official canvassed provisional and absentee ballots from the Utah County Clerk's Office regarding Proposition 6. The final and certified numbers are as follows:

FOR	Proposition 6 votes changed from 2993 to 3270
AGAINST	Proposition 6 votes changed from 3522 to 3836

Be safe, lock doors to the home and car, and do not assume it could not happen in your neighborhood. Also, continue to do what Highland is best at -watch out for our neighbors. 10400 North Temporary Road Closure

Contractors closed 10400 North in Highland between 6400 West and Paradise Circle (approx. 6550 West) on Monday, November 26th. The closure is expected to last for 5 weeks to install a pedestrian under-crossing as part of the Murdock Canal Trail Project.

The under-crossing will provide safe passage for trail users across 10400 North. A detour route will be set up around Mitchell Hollow Park to provide east/west access through the area.

The Murdock Canal Trail project is 16 miles long and runs from 800 North in Orem to the Thanksgiving point Interchange of I-15 in Lehi. The entire length is expected to be complete mid-summer 2013.

With the official numbers confirmed, the vote against Proposition 6 repeals Ordinance 2012-12 regarding days of operation for businesses in Highland.


Christmas Tree Pick-Up

Lone Peak Fire District News

This Holiday Season there are a few fire safety items that we would like to address. Remember to keep all open flames secured within a fire resistant area. Open flames such as candles, especially in bedrooms, are a high cause of house fires. When using heaters inside a home, tent, etc. make sure that they are designed for closed spaces. Heaters that burn fuel are usually not designed to be used inside and produce carbon monoxide, a deadly gas. Make sure that your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors are working with fresh batteries installed.

If you live near a fire hydrant please make sure that the snow is removed with at least a three foot clear radius around it. During a fire, time is of the essence. Removing the snow makes it faster to locate and attach fire hoses to take care of an emergency.
